All that is needed is a couple of sentences; you don’t have to provide an in-depth critique (unless you just want to, but unless you review books for a living or something, who has time for that!)



Construction Begins on the Alice Robertson House

Praise the Lord and pass the nail gun! We cut a ribbon (in Alice's favorite color of blue) to mark the beginning of the restoration of the Alice Robertson House at 1109 Elgin in Muskogee. Our funds have only allowed us to replace the damaged or rotted wood on the front façade (which was basically everything!).

Now we're raising funds for Phase II of the project which will involve replacing damaged studs and fascia boards on the east side of the house. The estimated cost of this phase is \$5,000.
